Content:

Binuni-Demologan National High School participated the 7th Division Peace Village Residential Experience last October 27-30, 2011 at Peace Village, Kapatagan, Lanao del Norte. It was participated by the 2 teachers, and 17 students and a principal of this school.

The said activity aims to:

- a) revisit values and attitudes towards diversity, cultural and differences, tolerance and human dignity;
- b) manifest behaviours showing camaraderie and brotherhood with fellow participants regardless of culture, tribe, creed and socio-economical status;
- c) promote the spirit of respect and understanding of one's cultural belief in a complex and cultural diverse society;
- d) develop social interaction skills to promote peaceful relations among people of diverse group and communities; and
- e) realize the need for happy co-existence in Lanao del Norte.

This year's PVRE theme, "In a World so Big, discover that our differences are small." The activities include the Shower of Peace, Hataw, Hub Hopping, Peace Parade, Non- Violent Communication (NVC), Eucharistic Celebration and Ecumenical Prayer, Service Learning, Peace Arts, Fun Run for Peace, Isang Gabi ng Pasasalamat, Kids Say No to Guns, Pledge to Peace, Flag Hugging, Meditation, Peace Summit, and Panaw sa Dapit Alim .

Experience:

During our 4 days of staying at the Peace Village, it was a great experienced for all of us, when we witnessed and participated all the activities. The Shower of Peace was great and it symbolizes the cleansing of one's self from biases and prejudices. The Hataw that were done

every morning really perspires us everyday. We really enjoyed the Peace Parade because it showcased different but colorful and beautiful fantasy land attire worn by every participants including the Schools Division Superintendent, Division Supervisors, administrators, Teacher participants and students. I have seen the joy and excitement in the face of all participants. Another significant activity during the 7th PVRE was the Meditation led by a Monk from Thailand, it was a way of developing inner peace and promoting peace with other. We also enjoyed watching and listening during the peace summit, the student speakers were really amazing as they relate their stories on the importance of peace and their ideas on how to achieve it peacefully, all of them really have brilliant minds and ideas. The last activity that we participated was Panaw sa Dapit Alim, it was fun and fulfilling that after stepping 25 steps in going up to reach the top of Dapit Alim, we felt the fresh air and observed the beauty of nature above the mountain. We thank God for the wonderful experience that He allowed to happen for all of us.

Content:

Binuni-Demologan National High School held its 5th School-Based Peace Camp last October 30-31, 2012 at the school campus. It was participated by 224 students of this school.

The said activity aims to:

- a) Carry out LN Division's thrust in promoting peaceful coexistence among school children;
- b) Bring young people to the Lord;
- c) manifest behaviours showing camaraderie and brotherhood with fellow participants regardless of culture, tribe, creed and socio-economical status;
- d) promote the spirit of respect and understanding of one's cultural belief in a complex and cultural diverse society;
- e) develop social interaction skills to promote peaceful relations among young people of diverse religious affiliations

Experience

Activities for the Peace Camp had started five days before the actual date when the would-be participants led by the Values Ed. Club Officers practiced songs for the Praise and Worship. This was done by year level.

Meanwhile, the management committee, composed of Values Ed. Mentors, led by the Values Ed. Coordinator, assigned facilitators for the peace camp from among the officers and members of the club, especially from those who actively join the weekly household meetings. Officers of the Day from among the president and the vice presidents were also assigned.

The chairman of the committee on Secretariat, Mrs. Mildred Cellerio, grouped the would-be participants into four, to compose the break-away sessions. This aimed to increase active participation

among students. The lists of grouping were posted on the bulletin board the day before the camp for student information and guidance. The said lists were used during the registration which was done by group. The attendance sheets were also encoded and arranged according to the group where the students belong. Student-facilitators were also assigned to take charge of each group's attendance.

There was a sixty percent turnout of student participation. The students were involved in various activities and lectures which were all spiritual in content, focusing on the individual's relationship with God.

The camp began with the registration of delegates by group where the students belong. Four pairs of student-facilitators took charge of the registration and the participants' name tags which were color-coded. It was followed by an opening program.

During the program, the School Values Education Coordinator, Mrs. Jenny Martizano, gave the welcome address and the statement of purpose. The said program was highlighted by Praise and Worship led by the Values Ed. Club President, Joshua Melvin Cellerio.

After the opening program was Lecture 1 entitled "God's Love and His Plan for Us" by Engr. Buenafe Panoril Jr, last year's speaker of the same topic. This time, he focused on God's Plan stressing the passage in Jeremiah 29:11. (*For I know the plans I have for you, plans for your prosperity and not harm, plans to give you hope and a future, thus says the Lord.*)

For the first time, the succeeding two lectures for that day, "Who is Jesus Christ for Me?" and "Repentance, Healing and Forgiveness", were done in break-away sessions in four venues. The first venue which was the mini-gym was designated as Peace Room A. Its speaker was BDNHS alumnus and active YFC member, Elver Amper. The students in the II-Bravo classroom designated as Peace Room B, were lectured by Youth Leader Michael Francis Panoril. Students assigned in Peace Room C/II-Alpha classroom, were taken care of by Youth Pastor Mark Evan Panoril while eldest brother, Engr. Buenafe Panoril spoke before students assigned in Peace Room D, which was the IV-Bonifacio Room. After each lecture, each group moved to another peace room to listen to another lecturer.

At the end of the day, the students gathered in the plenary hall for a group discussion and reporting of outputs by representatives of various groups.

Day 2 also had lectures followed by group activities such as intercessory prayer/praying over (after lecture 4), sharing of personal experiences, answering of questions, writing personal reflections and reporting. Lectures 4 and 5 were entitled, "Receiving Peace through the power of the Holy Spirit" and "Life and Mission of Peace Loving Youth". This time, the number of groups was reduced into three because of the unavailability of the fourth speaker.

. The two younger Panoril Brothers were still lecturers. Meanwhile, two more YFC Leaders also lectured on the same topics – Khendy Lyn Balansag, Lecture 4 and Mark Anthony Danlag, Lecture 5.

. After all the lectures was the closing program which also highlighted a Praise and Worship. Student-representatives from the four groups gave their impressions. There was also giving of Challenge by Mark Anthony Danlag followed by Acceptance and Commitment to Peace by Values Ed. Vice President Marilyn Sumaylo. During the said program, the management committee led by the Peace Coordinator, expressed gratefulness to the speakers by giving tokens of appreciation and by

praying over them. After the closing program, there was a Cleanup Activity in the mini-gym and in the plaza by all peace camp participants.

Problem Encountered

There was only 60 percent participation of the student population. This is because of other Values teachers' lack of cooperation and lack of concern for students' spirituality and evangelization. They did not require nor encourage their students to participate the said camp. Some did not even inform their students about it.

Recommendation

It is therefore recommended that teachers who have more concern on students' spirituality be given Values Education subject(s) next school year. We consider Ms. Geniebev Palay and Mrs. Adelina Cimeni as teachers who have the said quality.
