II. Planned Activities

There will be series of lectures on theories that will help enhance their teaching skills. Professionals on these areas will be invited to share their knowledge with the daycare teachers. To expose them with topics regarding different subject areas, an educational tour on different places of interests will also be part of the activities. Lunch and snacks will be provided to participants during the entire duration of the seminar. A socialization night will also be held for a quality bonding time of both the participants and the community development team of the college. There is a provision for housing and transportation for the fieldtrip. Seminar kits will be provided as well as souvenir shirts for the participants.

III. Actual Activities

Day 1, May 15, Wednesday, started with the registration and a message of inspiration by Assoc. Prof. Marilyn C. Quintana, UST Simbahayan Director. A lecture on "Teaching Strategies for Pre-School Teachers" was given by Mrs. Marichou T. Beltran, an expert of this field, faculty member and E-LEAP Coordinator of the College of Education. The participants were also exposed to Basic Computer Lecture and hands – on activities which was given by Assoc. Professor Joel L. Adamos, Faculty Member of the Mathematics Department of the college. An Art Workshop was facilitated by abled students of the college, Mr. Atom Von Monfero

and Ms. Deanna Punzal, who taught “Origami” or the art of paper-folding. Both students are incoming Third Year students taking up B.S.E. Major in Mathematics. A socialization night was conducted with dance lecture and session given by Ms. Pri-Ann Tinipunan, Coordinator of the Library and Information Science Department of the College of Education. There were also fun games, raffle and dinner.

Day 2, May 16, Thursday, was a whole day of educational tour and exposure to cultural and scientific topics and know-how's. First was a visit to the Pambansang Museo ng Pelikulang Pilipino at Mowelfund, Quezon City, where participants saw the memorabilias of the film-making industry of the country including equipments, pictures, props and costumes of classic screen movies, actors and actresses. It was a nostalgic visit because participants were able to discover the history of film-making in the country. Next stop is at the Philippine Science Centrum in Marikina City. Participants were able to see, touch, hear and feel in this first interactive science center- museum in the country. There were exciting science tour of the galleries. It was also in Marikina that they visited the Shoe Museum, home to almost 1,000 pair of shoes by former first Lady Imelda Marcos and some popular celebrities. In the afternoon, they passed by the Quezon Memorial Circle, a national park and a national shrine located in Quezon City. It is located inside a large traffic circle in the Elliptical Road. Its main feature is a tall mausoleum containing the remains of Manuel L. Quezon, the second official President of the Philippines and his wife, First Lady Aurora Quezon. The last place that they visited was the Ninoy Aquino Parks and Wildlife, a zoological and botanical garden with children's playground and man-made lagoon. A sumptuous dinner at the Kamayan Restaurant in Quezon City concluded the day-long tour.

Day 3, May 17, Friday, was a half day lecture of the seminar. Mrs. Aurora Cristine Bermudez, SWDB Coordinator of the college, provided legal advices after she lectured on “What to Teach Our Children Regarding the RH Bill.” Main speaker, Ms. Glenda Derla of the DSWD-NCR, gave them updates on the day care school conditions

of the country. She also reiterated the rights of the day care teachers along with their responsibilities to their young students and their obligations to the government. The three – day seminar ended with the closing ceremony and giving of certificates of participation. The Tarlac participants went home after lunch time.

The program was hosted and assisted by some quadricentennial scholars of the university, Mr. RJ Macarilay and Ms. Rmae Briones.

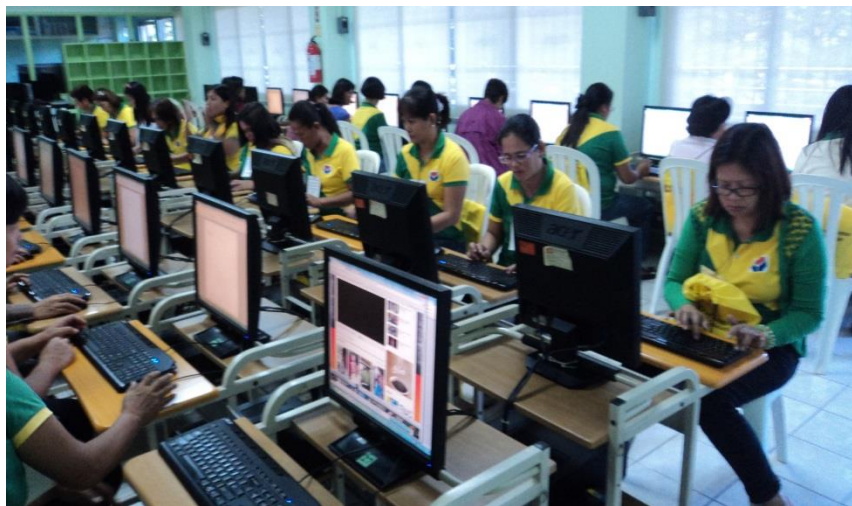
