
1. Program : We Share, We Care 1.0
2. Date : February to August 2018

4. Venue : Aborigine Village in Gelang Patah, Johor Bahru
5. Objective :
 - i. Encourage sharing habit by providing daily necessities to indigenous people.
 - ii. Improve the life condition of poor children.
6. Number of people : 30 volunteers (Headmistress, PTA members, students)
7. Activities :

No.	Activity	Person in-charge	Details
1.	Promoting this activity to every student.	Counselling teacher	Teacher in charge conveyed information to every student regarding the programme. Students were encouraged to donate their old clothes and toys generously to the indigenous residents.
2.	Sort and categorise the things donated by parents.	All the teachers and students	Teachers with the help of students sorted and packed the classified items into categories accordingly.
3.	Sending the donated items to the aborigine village	30 volunteers (Headmistress, PTA members, students)	Chairman of PTA communicated with the chief village regarding the living condition of the indigenous. Daily necessities were donated to the less fortunate. Toys and books were distributed to the school going children.

8. Program evaluation

- 8.1 Through this meaningful activity, students understand the greatness of sharing and how their little effort can help change someone's life. We hope to strengthen the value of sharing and gratitude among the students and our community. The school also hopes the students will always appreciate and be grateful of everything they have.
- 8.2 When allocating the daily necessities to the indigenous residents, we realised that the children and their families live in unhygienic condition. The level of sanitation and health attainment are low among the indigenous. Also, most of the families in this remote area could not afford to send their children to school.
- 8.3 *We Share, We Care 2.0* will be launched where medicine and health care products will be gathered and distributed to the targeted group.

4. Venue : Aborigine Village in Perling, Johor Bahru (Kampung Orang Asli, Bakar Batu Perling)
5. Objective :
 - i. Improve sanitation and health condition of indigenous communities.
 - ii. Reduce the risk of transmission of diseases by providing basic hygienic and body cleaning necessities.
 - iii. Support the household of poor children by providing staple food to sustain life.
6. Number of people : 35 (Headmistress, PTA members, volunteers from community, students)

7. Activities :

No.	Activity	Person in-charge	Details
1.	Promoting this activity to every student and local communities.	Counselling teacher	Teacher in charge conveyed information to every student regarding the programme. Students were encouraged to donate healthcare necessities and medicines for the needy. The programme was also promoted to the public through the school's official Facebook page.
2.	Sort and categorise the things donated by parents.	All the teachers and students	The volunteers sorted and packed the items into categories accordingly. The items collected were oil, rice, cooling pads, fever reducing tablets, treatment for lice control, bandages, antiseptics, toiletries and detergent.

3.	Sending the donated items to the aborigine village located in Perling	35 volunteers	<p>For the first visit, staple food such as cooking oil and rice were given to the indigenous families.</p> <p>In the second visit, medicines and health care necessities were distributed to the indigenous people.</p> <p><i>'Little Bun Programme'</i>: Boxed of bread were collected from Perling bakery and sent to each family of the aborigine village.</p>

8. Program evaluation

- 8.1 It is hope that this programme would encourage the spirit of '*giving back to the society*'. The indigenous could improve their health and living condition with the medicines and sanitation products given.
- 8.2 Many children are unable to attend school as their families could not support them. Mostly are not well educated. As they could not read the labels on the food and medicines, they were taught the proper method to use the products and basic way to treat their injuries and illness.
- 8.3 This activity will serve as a long term programme and will continue in the coming years. More communities are encouraged to join this meaningful activity.
